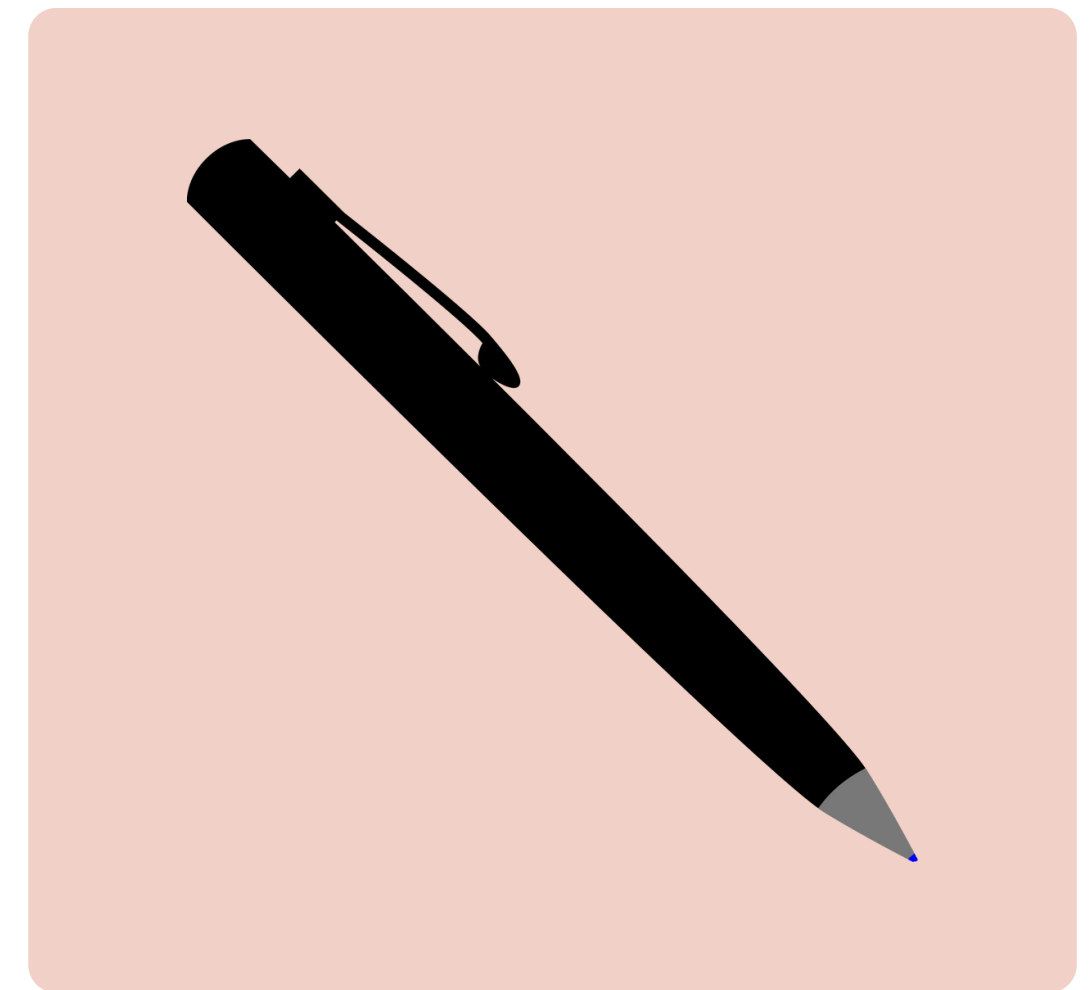
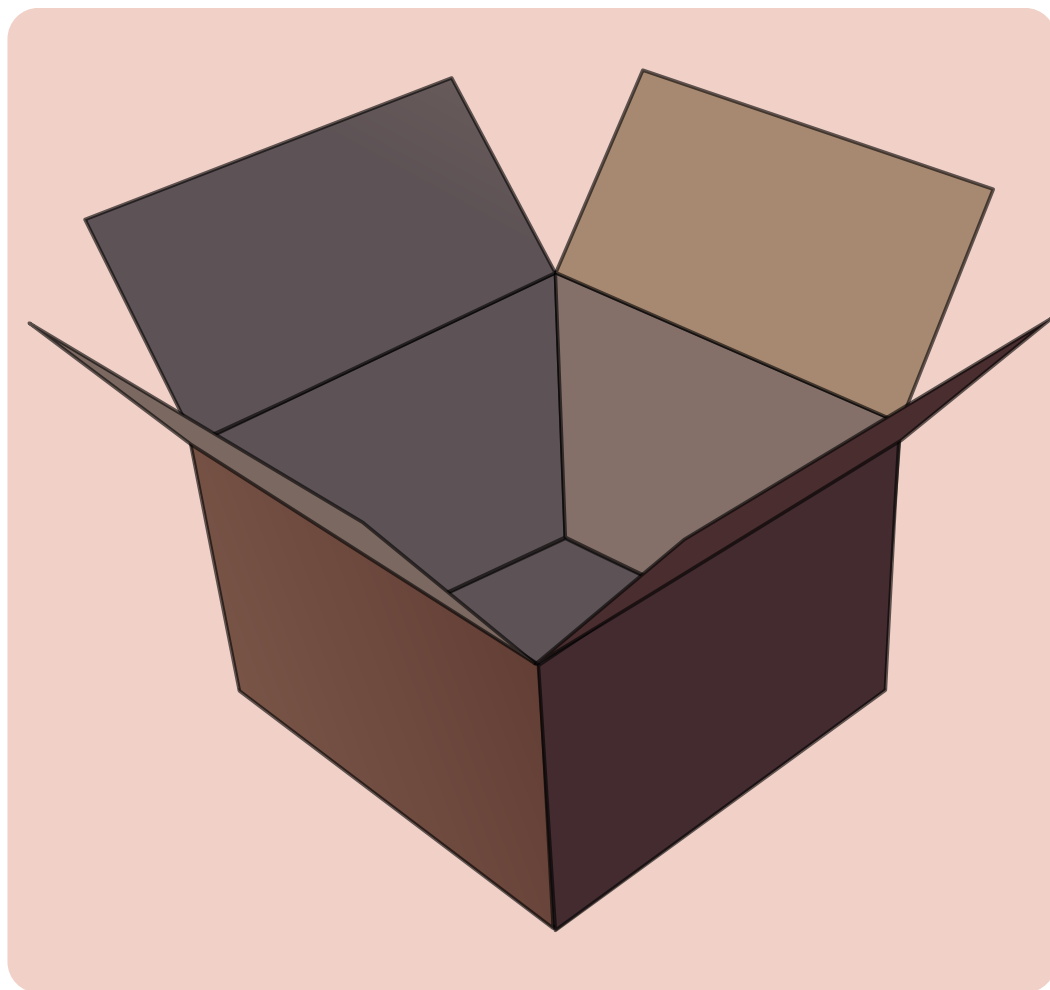

# Process (1st part):



1

Students are handed little pieces of paper.

2

Everybody writes down a problem that a person could face while working or trying to get into the STEAM field.

3

One problem - one paper. The goal is to write as many problems as students can think of.

4

All the papers should be placed into the box.



## Process (2nd part):

5

A student draws out one paper from the box;

6

Reads the problem out loud to the class.



7

Gives some ideas how to solve the problem and where could it come from?

Other classmates also share their ideas.


*\*REPEAT 5-8 until the box is empty*





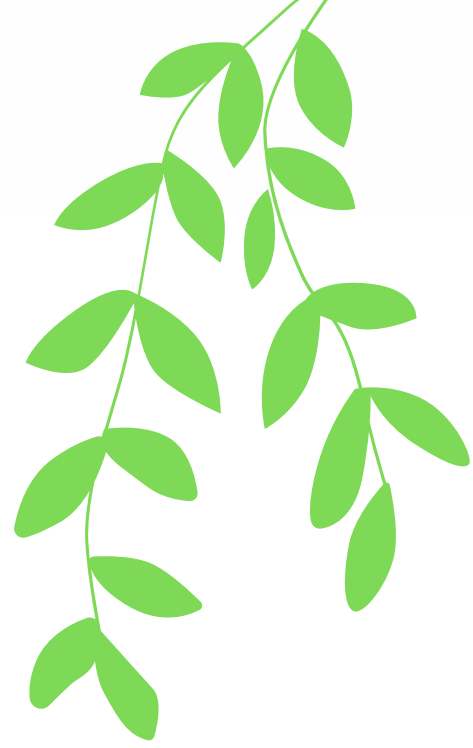

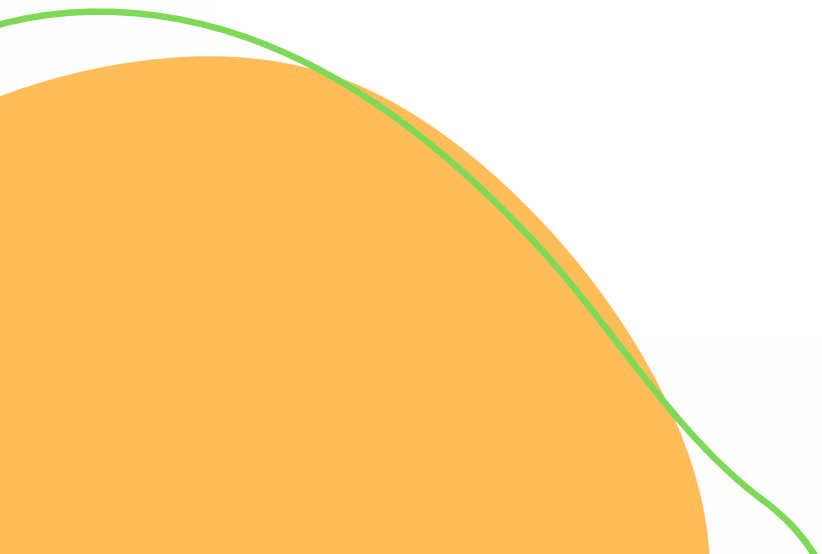

Were there problems that would likely occur more often for one gender than the other?


