SUMMARY	As far as the purpose and aim of the GP is concerned, with this educational material we are trying to raise awareness of the fact that there are examples of jobs that until not so long ago were considered the preserve of men, based on a successful example. In this case it is the architect Dame Zaha Hadid. Through her work she has shown that architecture is a field where women can be creative and competitive despite occupational stereotypes.
TEACHING PRACTICE (STEP BY STEP)	Students will discuss the topic: The woman who changed the Architecture world, the British-Iraqi architect Dame Zaha Hadid Often known as the "Queen of the Curve," Zaha Hadid was one of the most admired and extraordinary architects of her time. Forbes even named her among the 100 most powerful women in the world. Her daring and unconventional buildings tiptoe the line between fantasy and reality, changing our understanding of what architecture can do.
